
Considering creations with CONCRETE IDEAS

"Concrete pools are customised, handmade and built on site to any specification," he says, and asserts that "concrete has unmatched durability and strength." To explore the possibilities of what a concrete pool can offer you, and how it can be integrated seamlessly into the surrounding landscape, Linke says, "Landscaping with a concrete pool is only limited by your imagination. A PRACTICED PROCESS

Building a pool can be a big decision, especially as it will alter the very layout of how you interact with your outdoor space on a daily basis. To ease you into the process so that you aren't overwhelmed, Linke offers up sound advice on the steps Graziani Pools takes long before excavation even occurs. He says, "In creating pool and landscape designs, we use a 3D rendering design program to give customers realistic illustrations and video of their pool project." This way, all parties involved in the project can be on the same page and avoid any costly returns. In this step, any issues that may arise are "ironed out early", giving the client "confidence and trust that their vision is being brought to life".

For Graziani Pools, Linke asserts that their works are "incredibly fluid and fast moving", with the construction progress a "cooperative collaboration with builders and



other trades." This ensures that there is a functionally stream-lined process that avoids those pesky snags that can delay projects. "People often have a simplified understanding of what is involved in building a swimming pool," says Linke. Being transparent with his clients, he ensures that they are well informed on the multi-stage process and sets timeframes for each stage so that they feel that they are in capable hands. "We also set expectations for progress payments so that they can budget for their project accordingly," says Linke.

As someone who has overseen many projects in his professional career, Linke breaks down the concrete pool installation process into a compact 13 stages. It begins with site preparation, excavation, formwork and steel fixing, pre-plumbing, all the way to interiors, fill and balance, and then finally – the handover. According to Linke, ultimately, "the application of a concrete pool is endless. It can be built as part of the house structure, part of the home on the second floor or suspended over a sloping block, complete with infinite edge taking in the view." Whatever you're looking for, concrete pools are the way to go.

NOW WHAT?

If you're reading this and already have a concrete pool, Linke also has nifty advice on how to maintain it so that you can keep it clean and sparkling all year round. His main tip to ensure adequate filtration time and pool chemistry maintenance is to install sanitation and PH controllers, in-floor cleaning systems and robotic cleaners. "In addition to automatic cleaning, our advice is to regularly backwash, clean the filter and manually brush the internal pool surface," he advises. Linke also recommends to "super chlorinate" your pool twice a year to avoid any chances of algae build up. A pool cover and skimmer sock are also recommended "to limit organic matter entering the pool" and pool filter.



Being a trade qualified mechanical plumber for more than 20 years, Linke's skilled background in concreting, complex hydraulics, plumbing and many other aspects essential to pool installation makes his advice on pools invaluable. His parting words for those with pools or people looking to install pools, he says: "Treat your pool like your car – clean, service and regular maintenance is key to longevity (and a happy pool builder)."
